

## CONDITIONS

1. Entries are free and open to all members of approved Orchid Societies and other participating Societies.
2. The Show Marshal has the right to (1) reject, remove or re-arrange any exhibit, (2) determine the class in which any plant may be entered, (3) combine and/or establish extra classes if need be.
3. Entries are to be tabled and available for judging by 7.15p.m. when all competitors must leave the hall.
4. The Executive (President, Chief Steward and Show Marshal) shall be sole Arbiter should matters of dispute arise.
5. A Novice Exhibitor shall mean any member of Aspley Orchid Society who (a) has never won a first placing or higher award in any Aspley Orchid Society Show or (b) has never won maximum points in the yearly competition within the Society.
6. A specimen plant shall mean a mature plant, which has been developed from a single clone.
7. Plants entered in competitive classes shall have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least the preceding **six months** and shall be the property of the exhibitor.
8. Aspley Orchid Society Inc. accepts no liability for loss, destruction or damage sustained to plants either at the Show or in transit to and from the Show.
9. No blooms, even though spent, may be removed from a plant, or a plant removed from the Show until the termination of the Show, without special permission from the Show Marshal.
10. Responsibility for correct labelling of plants rests with the exhibitor.
11. Photographs may be taken at any time but not at the inconvenience of show patrons. The Society reserves the right to publish photographs of prize winning plants in selected magazines.
12. All exhibitors and exhibits shall conform to the rules and by-laws of the Society.
13. The Show Marshal, in conjunction with the Show Committee, shall have the right to refuse entry of any plant which, in his opinion, appears diseased.
14. Members wishing to sell plants are required to submit a plant for display at the Show.
15. No plants will be received in the **Plant Sales** after 7.15p.m. on Friday night, except, with the approval of the Plant Sales Organiser or representative.
16. The proportion of Spatulata parentage must be such that the hybrid shape does not show influences from any other Dendrobium section.
17. Minimal staking and tying and any other support will be permitted but shall not modify the natural inflorescence habit. The judging panel has the right to remove any staking and/or tie if necessary in order to ascertain the strength of the inflorescence. In all genera, no inflorescence is to be tied or supported on any part of the flower or its attachment to the inflorescence. Parafilm or florist tape is not allowed as ties.
18. The Judges' decision will be final.
19. All plants, to be judged, are to carry the name label as supplied by the society.
20. If the judging panel considers a plant benched at the show worthy of an award, the Show Marshal may give permission to the judging panel to point up the plant unless the owner has requested otherwise. If an award is granted the owner of the plant is under no obligation to accept the award.
21. Floral Art Section Only: Novice entrants may win their class three times before they must upgrade to Open Class. Any Novice entrant may enter Open Class but may not thereafter return to novice Class.  
Definition of accessories is anything used in arrangements other than plant material, containers, background or base. All arrangements to be in water or water retaining material.
22. Fire Ant Regulations must be adhered to.

- A1. Cattleya Alliance Hybrid Standard Type – under 100mm any colour
- A2. Cattleya Alliance Hybrid Standard Type – over 100mm any colour
- A3. Cattleya Alliance Hybrid - Any Cluster of at least 5 flowers
- A4. Cattleya Alliance Hybrid Non-Standard Type – up to 75mm
- A5. Cattleya Alliance Hybrid Non-Standard Type – over 75mm
- A6. Cattleya Alliance Species

### **Dendrobium Section**

#### **Notes: *Other than Australian Native (NB \* Class B1 – see Condition 16)***

- B1. Dendrobium Hybrid – Spatulata (\*predominantly from Spatulata parentage)
- B2. Dendrobium Hybrid– Intermediate (tending towards Spatulata shape)
- B3. Dendrobium Hybrid– Intermediate (tending towards Phalaenopsis shape)
- B4. Dendrobium Hybrid– Any Other
- B5. Dendrobium Species (other than Native)

### **Paphiopedilum Section**

#### **Notes:**

- C1. Paphiopedilum Primary Hybrid
- C2. Paphiopedilum Any Other Hybrid

#### **Notes: *Sarcanthinae* subtribe other than *Phalaenopsis* except for class D5.**

- D3. Vandachostylis Hybrid
- D4. Vandaceous Any Other Hybrid

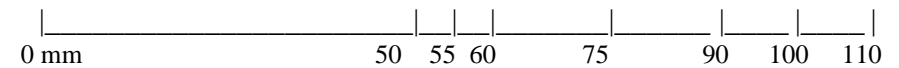
